

What is Ruuti Budget?

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Ruuti Budget is a tool to shape Helsinki in the image of the young

- Within Ruuti Budget, the young are able to present ideas and to vote for proposals about means to develop young people's leisure time and services and the city from a young perspective.
- Through Ruuti Budget you can have a say on the spending of the youth services' operations in the districts. In addition, 150,000 euros will be allocated for larger plans.
- In 2018, more than 10,000 young participated in deciding the makeup of the Ruuti Budget. The young do also take part in the implementation of the plans.



Vote and influence!

- The voting in October is about what plans to implement next year.
- Pupils in 6th to 9th grades are eligible to take part in the Ruuti Budget ballot.
- The OmaStadi platform will automatically direct you to vote for proposals concerning the Ruuti Budget of your own district. You are entitled to vote for three proposals.





What is Omastadi?

OmaStadi is Helsinki's way of doing participatory budgeting


- Annually Helsinki spends 4.4 million euros on implementing ideas put forward by residents of Helsinki.
- The sum is allocated to the seven districts according to their number of inhabitants. Moreover, there is a sum that has been reserved for plans that are relevant to the city as a whole.
- The city residents have brainstormed and drawn up plans using the OmaStadi.hel.fi site as a tool.

Vote and influence!

- The voting in October is about what plans the City will implement.
- You may vote in the district of your choosing and in all of Helsinki.
- As you go about voting, you may choose several plans until you have used up the sum that had been allocated to the district.
- The plans with the most votes will be carried out.
